Public Spaces Protection Order

Anti Social Behaviour Policing and Crime Act 2014 s.59

Notice is hereby given that London Borough of Hillingdon ("the Council") has made the following Public Spaces Protection Order under section 59 of the Anti-Social Behaviour Policing and Crime Act 2014 ("the Act"):

1. The land described in the schedule below ("the restricted areas") being land in the area of the Council is land to which the Anti-Social Behaviour Policing and Crime Act 2014 applies and will be protected by the making of this Order

2. The Order may be cited as the (Hayes Town Centre - Church Road to Parkway and Hayes Station to Longmead Road) Public Spaces Protection Order ("the Order") and came into force on 1 July 2015 for a duration of 3 years

3. The effect of the Order is to impose the following conditions on the use of the land:

Conditions in the Order which are prohibitions:

- (a) In the restricted areas a person commits an offence if without reasonable excuse he or she continues to carry out activities from which they are prohibited namely
- i. **Being verbally abusive to any person or behaving in a way which causes or is likely to cause harassment, alarm or distress to another person**
 - ii. **Continuing to drink alcohol or consume intoxicating substances when required to stop doing so by an authorised officer**
 - iii. **Gathering in groups of two or more persons unless going to or from a parked vehicle or waiting for a scheduled bus at a designated bus stop**
 - iv. **Entering or attempting to enter (unless the person is a registered resident of or the invited visitor to an address within) Austin Road estate or Skeffington Court**

Conditions in the Order which are requirements:

- (b) In the restricted areas a person commits an offence if without reasonable excuse he or she fails to comply with any activity that they are required to undertake namely
- i. **Leave the area when required to do so by an authorised officer and not return within 48 hours**
 - ii. **Surrender any alcohol or intoxicating substances in his or her possession when required to do so by an authorised officer**

In the restricted areas any person who continues drinking alcohol having been required to desist by an authorised officer under condition (a)ii above or fails to hand over any alcohol in his or her possession when required to do so by an authorised officer under condition (b)ii above commits an offence under section 63 and is liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding level 2 on the standard scale or fixed penalty notice of a maximum £100.

" Hayes Town Centre - Church Road to Parkway and Hayes Station to Longmead Road "
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A person who fails without reasonable excuse to comply with conditions (a) i iii and or (b) i above, commits an offence under section 67 of the Act and is liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding level 3 on the standard scale or fixed penalty notice of a maximum £100.

Schedule of the restricted areas

The restricted area is all the area which is public land owned or managed by the council, including those parts of council owned housing which are used in common, within the area bounded by (and including) Station Road (junction with Nestles Avenue), Eastholme, Longmead Road, Church Road, Nield Road, Birchway, Parkway, Pump Lane.

The restricted area is the area within the boundary shown on the attached map.

General

An authorised officer means a Local Authority Employee, a person designated by the Local Authority, a Police Officer or Police Community Support Officer.

The Council is satisfied that the conditions set out in sections 59, 64 & 72 of the Act have been satisfied and that it is in all the circumstances expedient to make this order for the purposes of reducing anti social behaviour in the restricted areas. The Council makes the order because anti social behaviour in the restricted areas has had a detrimental effect on the quality of life of those in the locality. The effect or likely effect of this is of a persistent or continuing nature such as to make this unreasonable, and justifies the restrictions imposed in this order. If any "interested person" desires to question the validity of this Order on the grounds that the Council had no power to make it or that any requirement of the Act has not been complied with in relation to this Order, he or she may apply to the High Court within six weeks from the date on which this Order is made.
